

Pylon Racing

31st May @ Clausens Farm

I arrived home Wednesday evening and a box has arrived by courier, what's in it?... Well for a while now the trusty old TT-46 Pro has been sounding and running like a wheezing anemic. The fact it has swotted Marcel from the sky in mid air collisions 3 times and kept running as well as hitting terra firma 3 times at 250KpH over the past 18 months of racing may have something to do with its deteriorated condition...

Then there's the 'you're not flying the right line', 'You'd be faster if you had HV servos' etc... What a load of bollocks, it comes down to one simple fact, I needed more power and maybe a slight bit of weight loss and I'd be 10 seconds a race faster and competitive again!

So what was in the box?... Simply put, what I hoped would be a can of whoop ass in the shape of a brand new O.S. 46AX-II engine.

Under 2hrs in the man cave and the engine was installed, the throttle servo and battery had been swapped out for lighter items and I had saved 120g of weight so the old girl was now sitting right on 1.7Kg. Now to put a flight or two on it and go racing on Sunday.

Saturday afternoon came around and I headed to the club field, the engine was tighter to turn over than Aunty at a 1/2 price + get a second item for free closing down sale. I fire it up at 2 1/2 turns open, screw the needle down to 1 1/2 turns open at which point it's still rich and I go for a fly. Well I could see why a few of the



guys are flying in the mid 1:30's for a race time - this thing was fast, Jeremy Clarkson would approve!...

Sunday morning rolls around and I head to the field after stopping for the mandatory pie, doughnut and coke brekkie - thanks BP...Marcel has been out early and set up the course, there is little wind and it's slightly overcast, so perfect for racing. The Viper looks rock solid on the practice flight and the O.S's performing well. Eventually the others show and the racing gets under way but not before Marcel decides he's a bit scared of another mid-air and wants to fly in the other heat...

We push through 5 rounds of sport 500 with the only casualty been Paul Clausen who broke the tail of his Snyper on landing and continued with his back up model. I did have the prop nut come loose on the second start and had a quick dash to the tool box for an allen key to re-lock the nut but still got away on time.



The results were close between PC and myself with only a second between us in each race. Posting consistent 1:35ish times was no problem with the new set up and I can see a few more seconds dropping off in the coming races. The rest of the pack were back in the mid 1:40's to 1:50 time bracket.

Next up was the Fast 500 class and there were three entries, PC, John Danks and Frazer. The racing was very close over the five rounds with John Danks being dethroned by Frazer by about 2 seconds total!

All in all it was a good turn out and everybody had a great time in pleasant conditions.


